Friends of KC Animals (FoKCA) is a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) organization that acts as a liaison between area shelters, rescue groups and the public aiming to help all animals in our community that are abused, neglected, lost or abandoned. FoKCA secures rescue for shelter animals and strays, gathers donations for area shelters and rescues in need of supplies, organizes adoption events and pays for medical treatment of ownerless dogs, cats and the like that would otherwise receive no attention. In addition, Friends of KC Animals helps pay for medical services for animals experiencing serious illness or injury when their pet owners are not currently in a position to afford the necessary services to improve the animals' health. Our goals are to educate the public on what people can do to help animals in need that they encounter, to facilitate the spay/neuter of more pets, to help suffering animals that have no one to speak and act for them, to encourage adoption over purchasing pets, to help pet owners who have nowhere to turn and to build awareness about the dire need to construct a new animal shelter at a different location in Kansas City, Missouri*.
